#### Report for Calendar Year 2012

Philip Rancourt (1974) Chief, Ed Grosso (1975) Assistant Chief, Hedy Lipez (1997), Secretary/treasurer, Mike Birch (2005), Mike Donlon (1994), Diane George (1975), Mike Holden (2003), Max LaCasse (2012), Chuck Morrone (2000), Carlanne Rancourt (1975), Steve Rancourt (1994), Sadeo Yagi (2009)

The mission of our fire department is to respond effectively to emergencies while providing for safety of firefighters, residents, environment and property, by participating in ongoing professional training and procuring upgraded equipment.

#### Projects:

- Several members worked on fire station repairs including installing new energy efficient windows, and, maintenance of the fire trucks, repair of emergency lights and maintenance of the ATV.
- All members participated in continuing education: First Responder, CPR and AED recertification.
- One of our members organized an Emergency Vehicle Driver Training Program that was offered to Hancock, Lanesborough, New Ashford and Williamstown fire departments. The course was offered by MIIA. MIIA is the insurance agency that insures most towns in Massachusetts. All members of our department are now certified.
- Several members offered instruction to our community on hands-only CPR.
- In an effort to improve communication during emergencies, our fire department benefited from a Northern Berkshire County regional grant with several towns providing mobile fire truck radios and pagers for members. All radios and pagers are now compliant with Federal Communications Commission regulations for narrow band operation.
- Members obtained a free 1991 KME air force surplus tanker/pumper which they are working on with plans for it to replace Engine 2 as a backup vehicle.

#### Town of New Ashford

#### SHAKER MOUNTAIN SCHOOL UNION #70 REPORT

As Bill Ballen retired from his position as superintendent of Shaker Mountain Union #70, I entered and feel very fortunate to have been selected as your new superintendent. I want to thank Bill for his guidance and support as I transitioned into the position. He has been very generous with his time and information. Since July 1<sup>st</sup> I have been working to get to know people in our three towns and to build positive working relationships.

One of my first actions as superintendent was to ask psychologist Dr. Ward Johnson to return to district on a part time basis and continue on as our school psychologist, and he graciously accepted. I also asked Jenevra Strock, retired Special Education Director, to return on a part time basis to continue to serve as the District's Special Education Director, and she, too, graciously accepted. Both of these individuals have been extremely helpful in orienting me to the Union as they continue to serve all of us well.

As last school year was wrapping up, Hancock interviewed to fill a number of vacancies. They needed a full time teacher for grades three and four, a paraprofessional for the same grade configuration, a part time special education teacher, a part time science and technology teacher, and a part time physical education teacher. The school was fortunate to find capable and qualified people to serve in each role. Ms. Jessica Passetto was hired to teach the Grades 3 and 4 combination class. She came to us from Cheshire Elementary. Mrs. Linda Chesney, who was doing our After School Program, was hired to be the paraprofessional for the Grades 3 and 4 classroom. Dr. Shirley McClellan, who provided reading support in Hancock last school year, was hired as the part time special education teacher. She has had extensive experience in the area of special education. Mr. Brian Keller was hired as the part time science and technology teacher and also serves as the part time physical education teacher. Brian holds an Associate Degree in science and a Bachelor's Degree in Family and Consumer Science. He comes to us with teaching experience in North Adams and Bennington, VT. Christine "Tina" Yurmi was hired to do the After School Program.

Principal Jeanne Filiault has been making many changes at the school this year. She worked with her staff to orient them to the new Common Core Curriculum, which will replace the Massachusetts State Standards next school year. She also instructed her teachers how to write SMART (Strategic, Measurable, Action oriented, Realistic, and Timely) Goals, which is one of the requirements of the new state mandated teacher evaluation system. The new evaluation system also becomes effective in school year 2013-2014. Mrs. Filiault changed the Wednesday schedule to claim more time for instruction. This started in February, at which time all but the first Wednesday of each month was reassigned to become instructional time. The new time on task was devoted to MCAS-like instruction to better prepare Hancock students for the state tests.

Mrs. Filiault also identified teachers to become specialists in specific content areas and identified workshops for each specialist to attend to gain in skills and understandings that could then be shared with his/her colleagues. Mrs. Dix, math specialist, attended a math conference and Ms.

Passetto, English Language Arts specialist, attended one that addressed content area skills. Mr. Keller, science and technology specialist, attended a technology conference to hear about ways that technology can enhance instruction and Mrs. DelSordo, Pre-School, attended multiple workshops to learn how to make changes in the Pre-School Program that would qualify the Hancock's program to become a Certified A1 Program. Mrs. Filiault also formed data teams to review student data on AIMSweb as a means of measuring progress and indentifying students who needed more directed support.

The Monday afternoon ski program at Jiminy was well attended again this year and as, always, was a huge success. Mr. Bill Ballen returned to Hancock to once again run the After School Floor Hockey Program on Thursday afternoons this winter. The students were thrilled to have Mr. Ballen working with them again and we are grateful for the time he continues to donate to Hancock Elementary School.

I continue to meet with Hancock parents on a regular basis to share information regarding the direction of the school, to answer parent questions and to address concerns. I value this time as it provides me direct contact with parents and keeps me informed of their concerns and visions for the future of the school.

The Hancock School building project is complete. Bill Ballen, who agreed to see the project through its completion, has filed with the state to secure the final reimbursement.

This past summer was a busy time in Richmond as we focused on hiring teachers to fill the vacancies in the middle school. Mrs. Rachel Kanz was hired to teach English Language Arts to grades six through eight and serves as the eighth grade homeroom teacher. Mrs. Kanz came to us with teaching experience in Alaska and in New York state. Ms. Kristen Valenti, who taught math in Connecticut, is the new math teacher for the middle school and serves as the sixth grade homeroom teacher. Dr. David Purvis left the teaching staff of Marist College to become Richmond's new science teacher, and also serves as the seventh grade homeroom teacher. The three new teachers have worked together to form a strong middle school team and are providing high quality instruction for our students.

Shortly after the school year opened, Dr. Karin Deyo, Richmond Principal, resigned from her position. We were most fortunate to hire Mrs. Monica Zanin to serve as the Interim Principal for this school year. Mrs. Zanin came to us from Sage Park Middle School in Pittsfield.

At the direction of Principal Zanin, the staff has been discussing the new teacher evaluation system and practicing goal setting using SMART (Strategic, Measurable, Action-oriented, Realistic and Timely) Goals, a requirement of the new state-mandated evaluation plan. In order to set goals teachers had to examine artifacts they used to meet learning standards and provide evidence to measure student learning against those standards.

As we moved forward through this school year, teachers looked at and responding to student data. Mrs. Zanin created weekly meetings for teachers to collaborate, review their Math and

English Language Arts improvement plans per grade level, respond to intervention, including curriculum support and guidance, and share instructional strategies. Teachers met with each other to share instructional strategies and have rich discussions regarding student learning and ways to address the needs of their students. Professional development opportunities were offered and teachers took advantage of conferences on instructional best practices along with going out to other schools to observe similar grade level classes. Collaborating and sharing instructional tools and strategies with colleagues at RCS and with other teachers in the county will surely help move Richmond forward.

Some of the teachers joined the principal at a PARCC conference. PARCC stands for The Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers and is responsible for designing our new Common Core Standards and our future assessment system. RCS is committed to teaching these standards, which were adopted by Massachusetts and we are providing continuous professional development in this area.

Social and emotional education was also a priority at RCS and was built into the curriculum. Concepts were introduced and reinforced daily through our universal expectations, CARES: Cooperation, Assertion, Responsibility, Empathy and Self Control. The CARES Program was rolled out at a school-wide assembly on December 3<sup>rd</sup> by 8<sup>th</sup> graders who had prepared lessons to teach to the lower grades.

I have been meeting with Richmond parents in a morning coffee hour to share information and answer parent questions. This is an important time for me to hear parent concerns and gain their insights into school matters.

At the writing of this report, we were getting underway with a search for our permanent principal and expect that as you read this Town Report, we will have identified the individual who will be our principal long term.

In New Ashford, we are in the process of renegotiating the tuition contracts with Lanesborough and Mount Greylock. As always, we are working to keep the costs down. While we will need to complete the contracts before we can determine the exact amount of the budget for 2013-2014, it appears that we will end up close to a level funded budget. The Mount Greylock tuition contract with Hancock is also being negotiated at the time this report was written. Once the contract is completed, we hope to end up with a budget in Hancock that is very near the amount approved for the current year. This would be a significant achievement in both New Ashford and Hancock, as the current budgets are both lower than the budgets approved for 2012.
